Ongoing Issues

Testing, testing, and more testing

When last we left our heroes, changes were being explored and proposed at both the county and state level for the number, scope, and uses of standardized assessments, including proposed changes to the PARCC. Since we last met, two changes have been announced:

- -- PARCC testing will undergo modifications to reduce from two to one testing window; and
- -- MCPS is significantly changing its countywide final assessments on high school credit classes, starting with eliminating the county final requirement for some subjects in which there are also PARCC assessments.

Some parents have expressed concern that the BOE's vote was motivated more by an attempt to mollify the concerns about the amount of time spent on testing, without adequate attention to whether the remaining assessments are well suited to the purposes to which they'll be put. Some have also questioned whether elimination of the county finals is simply a tool to eliminate public outcry over the math final exam failure rates.

And some have expressed concern that the replacement assessments will not be standardized enough to be fair. When we met with Larry Bowers in August, he said that the final exams would not be eliminated until the alternative assessments have been developed. We will continue to monitor developments in this area.

Meanwhile, hot off the presses, as this report went to press on Aug. 31, the Maryland Teachers Association launched a half million dollar ad campaign on the theme of "Less Testing, More Learning." I don't watch television but I'm guessing these ads are not in favor of testing.
